

PROJECT CONNECT I'M LATE, BUT DO I GET THE JOB?

In a job interview a strong handshake and a happy, confident approach is viewed positively, but be sure to communicate what you want and prepare questions to ask because not doing so is a big negative in a job interview.

Recruiting experts Hays asked over 100 employers to list what impresses and what doesn't impress them about a candidate in a job interview. We found the ten best impressions you can make are:

- 1. Confident, happy and positive attitude
- 2. Strong presentation, in terms of communication skills, dress and/or handshake
- 3. Provision of real life examples to demonstrate answers
- 4. Ability to illustrate how you stand out as a candidate
- 5. Clear career plan or aspiration
- 6. Enthusiastic and passionate about the role
- 7. Communicate the benefits you can bring the business
- 8. Prepare questions in advance to ask the interviewer
- 9. Display a good understanding of the role/company
- 10. Be an active listener

What doesn't impress though are:

- 1. Poor verbal communication skills
- 2. Not answering the question asked
- 3. Not researching the company or role before the interview
- 4. Leaving a mobile phone on
- 5. Inability to provide solid examples of previous experience
- Exaggerating experience or skills
 Focusing on the negative rather than the positive in situations or experiences
- 8. Inability to answer technical questions
- 9. Arriving late
- 10. Not displaying an interest in the role

While each job is different, it seems that being happy and confident in a job interview does help improve your chances. If you smile, maintain eye contact and speak clearly, you present yourself as self-confident and assured about your ability to do the job.

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Gorgon Project and ProjectConnect reaches a significant milestone

The Gorgon Project has recently achieved a significant milestone, a total of 5000 companies have registered interest in working on or supplying goods to the Project on ProjectConnect. These companies have in total completed over 30,000 expressions of interest.

The Gorgon Project is Australia's single biggest resource project with an estimated resource base of more than 40 trillion cubic feet of gas and a nominal development life of at least 40 years. The Gorgon Project is building a Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) production facility on Barrow Island, 70kms off the Pilbara coast of Western Australia. The Gorgon Project is in its third year of construction and first gas is planned for 2014.

The Gorgon Project is operated by Chevron. It is a joint venture of the Australian subsidiaries of Chevron (approximately 47 percent), ExxonMobil (25 percent), Shell (25 percent), Osaka Gas (1.25 percent), Tokyo Gas (one percent) and Chubu Electric Power Company (0.417 percent).

During construction, the Project is expected to commit about \$20 billion to the Australian industry, creating about 10,000 direct and indirect jobs at peak construction.

Since the Project first listed on ProjectConnect in 2005, it has listed over 1,100 packages. A large number of successful suppliers have also been listed on ProjectConnect.

Chevron continues to be committed to working with Australian companies that can help them build a world class, safe and competitive project. Opportunities continue to be listed, especially under sub supply opportunities by successful Gorgon contractors, currently in 12 sub-projects on ProjectConnect.

The launch was officiated by the recently appointed Resource Sector Supplier Envoy, the Hon. Peter Beattie who has been prominently urging local industry to jointly bid on those projects to streamline offers for the large procurement packages typically offered by proponents.

Rapid Alliance has been in development over the last two years and is now in position to add extra competitive capacity to the drafting market, while providing opportunities for experienced and developing drafting professionals to remain and work in Western Australia.

Rapid Alliance is specifically designed to offer a professional alternative to current providers of shop detailing within Australia. It has sufficient resources and high levels of expertise to undertake the large opportunities within the resources and infrastructure industries.

Chairman of the Rapid Alliance Board Emidio Giardini said: "We want to be known as a business that is easy to deal with. We are not setting out to develop a business that simply becomes the largest within the industry. We want to be recognised as a well organised, coordinated business that offers a sustainable alternative to current market leaders".

Dr Stephen Hicks has been Manager of Structural Systems at the New Zealand Heavy Engineering Research Association since 2008. Besides composite construction, he has been working in the field of floor vibrations since 1997. From research programs supported by the European Commission and the UK government, which included in situ tests on steel-frame floors, Stephen co-authored the SCI design guide P354 entitled 'Design of Floors for Vibration: A New Approach'. SCI P354 has been widely used for office, residential, hospital floors and dance floors.
